

Braun brings over three decades of experience to the position. Previously, she served as Assistant United States Trustee with the Department of Justice, combatting abuses of the bankruptcy system and overseeing a team of attorneys and investigators. Braun also worked at Bet Tzedek Legal Services supervising attorneys and volunteers working on behalf of indigent Los Angeles County residents on consumer protection, housing, bankruptcy, probate, elder law, SSI and other matters.

Braun is passionate about representing the needs and interests of children in foster care. "I also am particularly

L.A.OPPORTUNITY YOUTH COLLABORATIVE PARTNER SPOTLIGHT: PATHWAYS TO HIGHER ED



For young people in foster care, who often

lack stability and consistent parenting, preparing for college and obtaining a degree can seem like insurmountable hurdles. That's where the work of the Opportunity Youth Collaborative, powered by the Alliance, comes in, bringing together a host of public and private organizations to improve systems and create pathways to success.

on linking the colleges to a new system called the Youth Coordinated Entry System," Petrass notes. "We have a housing shortage in Los Angeles, so the issue is a tough one. But we do have ways to improve how we connect students to available housing."

Data is one key to driving improvement. "Maybe one program for foster youth is doing well in terms of increasing GPA and another has great statistics about

Under the OYC umbrella, John Burton Advocates for Youth (JBAY) and the LA Chamber of Commerce spearhead the Foster Youth College Achievement Program (FYCAP), an exciting multi-pronged approach to intervention at every level to improve how foster youth prepare for, access, and ultimately navigate higher education.

Jessica Petrass, project manager for JBAY, traverses the county, seeding community organizations in one place with the wisdom and experience gained somewhere else. "I've been meeting with the 29 campuses in LA that have foster youth support programs and asking what's working, what's not?" she says. Currently, each campus has its own approach to supporting foster youth, with its own services and requirements. This results in confusion for students who are trying to navigate their options.

Homelessness is a particularly complex issue identified as a barrier to higher education by every one of the colleges with which JBAY works. "I have been working getting all of their student participants to complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). We want access to that kind of information," Petrass explains.

The task of creating pathways to college for students in foster care starts in high school or even earlier. With that in mind, the FYCAP team has brought together stakeholders, including Department of Child and Family Services and the LA County Office of Education, to make recommendations about ways to better serve students. Already, these recommendations have led to a pilot program in the Antelope Valley to leverage a core group of social workers to help students prepare for college and apply for financial aid. The pilot engages students as early as middle school.

For a child welfare system that tends to emphasize safety and secure placement over long-term goals like college and career, this work requires a shift in culture. Petrass sums it up: "Attaining higher education and meaningful careers is part of well-being, so the work is very worthwhile."

If we want to truly understand how to improve

foster care, we have to hear from young people and caregivers who have firsthand experience.

"I want to put humanity back into the way the system works," says Shari Walker, who was in foster care during her teenage years. She recounts how she felt physically protected but emotionally devastated by the experience.

"If I could change one thing, it would be separation of siblings," says Flo Valenzuela, who is entering her freshman year at UCLA this fall. "My brother and I were split up, and as a result, it took years to rebuild that relationship and it's still very difficult."

It is not enough to speak for vulnerable children and families; we must also ensure that they are invited to speak in settings where decisions that affect them are being made. That is why, for two decades, the Alliance has been bringing the insight and wisdom of those who have direct personal experiences of foster care to bear on policy and reform.

Advocacy is a skill, and it takes practice and preparation. Toward that end, we are pleased to announce the Advocacy Academy, an Alliance initiative that provides training, professional development, speaking opportunities, and more to those with direct experience of foster care who want to be part of the advocacy community. Alliance staff and community experts in policy, communications, and collective impact will help to train and support the advocates. Our hope is to amplify the voices of all of those who are calling for change.

Participants have the opportunity to take part in formal and informal speaking opportunities. They can also write letters, contact lawmakers, participate in legislative visits, reach out to educators, and speak at business roundtables and conferences.

The Advocacy Academy provides opportunities for anyone with firsthand experiences of foster care to help reform and improve the system.

In addition, the Academy will organize focus groups around important issues and disseminate findings to policy makers and community partners to help them better serve key populations, including relative caregivers, teen parents, and transition-age youth.

In fact, just recently, we convened a focus group of young parents who have been in foster care themselves. Among the many surprises? The parents spoke at length about the stress of taking public transportation to medical and other service appointments, describing how taking the train or bus with a young child often caused them to feel overwhelmed and unsafe. Their candid commentary is helping to inform innovative approaches to transportation for transition-age clients, particularly those with children.

Foster parents, including kin caregivers, are a key part of the Academy as well, and we will continue to leverage their involvement to promote policy change. For example, recently, one of our advocates, a grandmother

who stepped up to raise her granddaughter, helped us reach out to national policymakers. Her compelling firsthand account helped humanize abstract issues of federal funding and draw attention to the needs of relative caregivers.

In many ways, the Academy is the crystallization of the self advocacy we've been supporting since the beginning of our 25-year history. As we launch the Academy and expand the community of advocates, we hope that it will be a stone that causes outward ripples that continue to touch lives far and wide, until, together, we achieve a more just and equitable world for vulnerable young people.

PRO BONO SPOTLIGHT

Richard Ochoa, litigator at Bryan Cave LLP,

represents everything that we treasure in our exceptional pro bono community. Ochoa has handled more than 70 adoption and guardianship cases over the past nine years. As a bilingual attorney, he is particularly valued by our Spanish-speaking clients.

"I remember going to Edelman Children's Court for National Adoption Day the first time," he recalls. "It was a great experience. That event did it for me. Getting to see the joy the parents experience as they build or expand their families through adoption is so satisfying. And it was interesting to see all of the many parts that go into bringing an adoption to completion."

Ochoa notes that handling an adoption always gives him a sense of joy and energizes him to return to his core practice. "Litigation can be wearing," he says. "I enjoy this work because I love being around families, I love the look on the faces of the kids and their parents when they realize they are now a family forever."

Over the years, Ochoa has also experienced the pleasure of helping clients for whom he has already completed an adoption add another new family member. For example, one family that adopted a child with special needs returned to court with Ochoa a few years later for a second such adoption. "These are parents with big hearts and it's so rewarding. When someone wants to make that kind of investment in kids, the least I can do is expedite it!"

Today, Ochoa likes to encourage more junior attorneys to get involved in Alliance pro bono work. "I tell them that if you are looking for a pro bono experience where you can help someone almost instantaneously, this is it. You can spend two or three years litigating a typical pro bono case, or in that same period of time, as an Alliance pro bono adoption attorney, you can help 20 families."

POLICY UPDATE

Alliance debuts comprehensive guide aimed at getting more children into family settings

This year, one of the most sweeping reforms in the history of foster care in California went into effect. Continuum of Care Reform (CCR) emphasizes placing children in family homes whenever possible, rather than group homes. The Alliance has been deeply involved in providing guidance and leadership for counties across California, including Los Angeles, as they put CCR into practice.

The process of becoming an approved foster parent can be daunting. Families deciding to care for children in foster care need to be empowered—operating from a place of knowledge and not fear. The Alliance for Children's Rights and our partners at Children's Law Center, California Youth Connection, and Public Counsel, worked with county and state agencies to create a friendly, useful RFA guidebook to put families in the driver's seat. The guide provides a comprehensive

CCR included the passage of two bills (with a third in the works this year) that fundamentally restructure the laws around how a family is approved to care for a child in foster care, what funding and services a child receives, and how decisions pertaining to the child and family are made. CCR also mandates specific parameters for how group home facilities and Foster Family Agencies must be licensed.

For the sweeping changes envisioned by CCR to succeed, more children, particularly those with special needs, must be placed in family settings, with reduced reliance on group homes. That means recruiting, training, and supporting more foster parents. That is where the new Resource Family Approval (RFA) process comes into play. RFA is the new standard process by which all foster parents are approved. It is meant to ensure that all potential foster parents, including relatives, are given an equal opportunity to step up and care for a child.

step-by-step process for navigating RFA, and includes forms, tools, and materials that a family needs to get through the process. It was developed with input from caregivers themselves, and has been endorsed and widely distributed by the County of Los Angeles and other partners statewide.

Already we are receiving great feedback. Sylvie de Toledo of Grandparents as Parents had this to say:

"The Resource Family Approval Guide is AMAZING. Hopefully it will minimize the uncertainty and scariness of dealing with the child welfare bureaucracy. Knowing what comes next in the process helps our grandparents-as-parents families so much. On behalf of all RFA families we send a huge thank you to all that helped this project come to fruition."

The Alliance plans to issue new editions of the RFA guide to keep it current in the coming months.


